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PRESIDENT - STEVE STATZ

We had a bumpy start with our new property management, but things are getting smoother. We had an incident in December where the power was cut off for the clubhouse for lack of payment of our bills. It turned out that the automatic payments system was not transferred to our new bank and the address change was not submitted by IMPAC. Wentworth got the bills in late November and processed the payments, but too late for PSE&G, so they cut the power. It was restored the same day because a resident paid the bill with a credit card over the phone. Since then, all our utility bills were set up for automatic payments.

This month, the Monte Carlo gate was repaired and placed into service. The exit gate on Sedona is still broken. Once that gate is fixed, the Board will determine the best time to activate the main gates. A set of instructions on how to use the keypad entry system for visitors will be provided. If a resident desires, additional key fobs may be purchased that will activate the entry gate, but not the clubhouse.

A more robust video surveillance system has been installed at the main gate house which records all vehicles entering and exiting our community through that gate. The new system includes night vision technology.

The major activities planned for the Spring include completing contracts for our landscaping, clubhouse cleaning and maintenance, pool, pond maintenance, snow removal, painting of the pergolas, and repair of the clubhouse dormers. As you can see, the maintenance activities are stepping up, now that our community is over six years old. The previous Boards set aside money for deferred maintenance which will be used to pay for the painting and repairs.

Transition

There has been no new activity to report since the last issue of the Chant. The builder has not yet responded to our request to discuss the engineer report.

Law Suit

The law suit against our association is being handled by our insurance company and is progressing in a deliberate manner, in accordance with the insurance company's procedures.

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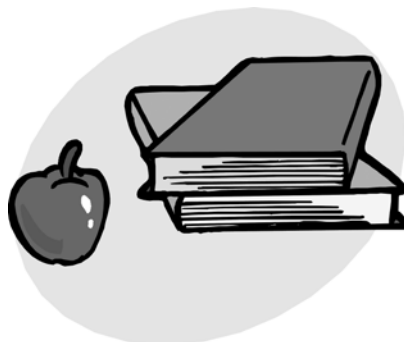
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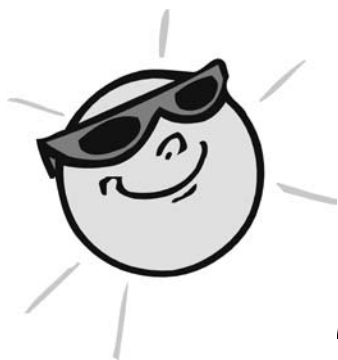
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COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Enchantment Board has approved the newly named "Properties Committee" (nee Maintenance) whose mission "shall be to make recommendations to the Board to ensure all Enchantment property assets are efficiently maintained for the benefit of all Association members."

Pond Health

One of Enchantment's largest "assets" is the Pond. This body of water is simply a large "retention basin" for street drains east of the Pond. It gets replenishment when it rains.....only when it rains! You might have thought the stream (when it's not dry) under the Monte Carlo bridge drains into the Pond. It does not. It actually bypasses the Pond on the east side, runs along the Pond on the south side and meets the Pond drainpipe at Sedona Bridge west of the Pond.

Your Properties Committee reviewed the plans, the chemicals required to combat algae and the aeration. (We also stepped around droppings from our geese friends. Not only are the droppings unsightly and disgusting, they pollute the water.) The RDG "approved" plans show 2 aerators, a fountain and a conflicting water depth. The 3 foot depth on 2 of 3 plans was of great concern. Did we own a pond or a puddle? A puddle would quickly fill with silt and become more costly in the chemical control of algae. Where are the two aerators? The Board was advised of the missing aerators and the need for a "baseline" of silt and water depth called bathymetry which is a "map" of the pond.

Late last year, the Board approved a bathymetry which reported that we have over 900,000 gallons of water with a very nice depth (8+feet) which runs for almost 300 of the pond's 400 foot length. This is very good news because deep water is cold and cold is anti-algae. Plant growth around the perimeter gobbles up nitrogen which the algae feed upon. The depth, the plants and the installation of the two aerators will further improve the water quality.

There is no truth to the rumor the paddle boat race and the large mouth bass fishing tournament will take place in September.

THE CENSUS AND WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

With the upcoming CENSUS to begin shortly we can expect every conceivable type of scam possible to get your identity and your money.

The first phase of the 2010 U.S. Census is under way and US Census Bureau (USCB) workers have begun verifying the addresses of households across the country.

Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data.

With that thought in mind here are some very basic but good bits of info to remember and pass along to everybody you know:

- Be Cautious About Giving Info for the US Census. Think before you respond and use common sense.
- Be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft.

So how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? **If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, he will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice.**

- DO - ASK TO SEE HIS IDENTIFICATION AND HIS BADGE before answering any questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home. An invite inside your home could be used to evaluate your home for valuables for a future burglary.
- Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to "VERIFY ADDRESS INFORMATION".
- DO NOT - give your Social Security number. The Census Bureau will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers, nor will employees solicit donations. Any one asking for that information is NOT with the Census Bureau.
- DO NOT - give credit card or banking information

to anyone, such information is not needed by the USCB.

- DO NOT - answer anything about your financial situation. The USCB should only ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range.
- **REMEMBER: NO MATTER WHAT THEY ASK, YOU REALLY ONLY NEED TO TELL THEM HOW MANY PEOPLE LIVE AT YOUR ADDRESS.**
- DO NOT - respond to inquiries from anyone associated with ACORN. THE CENSUS BUREAU HAS DECIDED NOT TO WORK WITH ACORN ON GATHERING THIS INFORMATION. No Acorn worker should approach you saying he/she is with the Census Bureau.
- DO NOT - respond to emails from that claim to be from the USCB. Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, the **USCB WILL NOT** contact you by Email, so be on the lookout for Email scams impersonating the Census.
- DO NOT - open internet links that claim to be from the USCB. **Never** click on a link or open any attachments in an Email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.
- DO NOT - allow and advise your children about never engaging a USCB canvasser in discussions. Children, even teenagers do not look at the same concerns or potential threats as adults and are easily manipulated. USCB personnel should not engage anyone but the adult in the home.

Remember, the information you provide will be available to the person collecting it but also to the general public for all intents and purposes. With the downturn in the economy there will be those out there that are trying to make a fast buck whether it is by burglarizing your home and selling contents at a pawn shop or stealing your identity and stealing your life savings. So **use caution** and **DO NOT** hesitate to contact the local Police Department or the USCB before you cooperate with these people if you have concerns.

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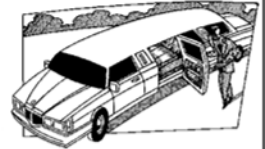
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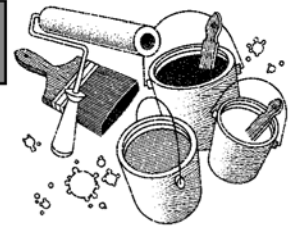


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
