Last year we commissioned an update to our reserve study, performed by Falcon Engineering. The study was performed in accordance with generally accepted practice and included estimating the remaining life of our facilities, and the amount we have already set aside in our reserve account. The Home Owners association is required to maintain a reserve fund to finance the replacement and repair of our common property. The



updated reserve study indicates that we must increase our contribution to the reserve fund to account for the increase in the costs of replacements and repairs estimated by the engineering study. The Board will be meeting with Falcon to clarify some of the assumptions, and recommendations. In addition, the report will be reviewed by the finance committee so they can help determine the amount of increase we should apply. The increase will be included in the 2016 budget.

Our volunteers are key to keeping our expenses down, since they provide services we would pay for if they did not help out. It is unfortunate that the participation of volunteers has been declining over the years, as the novelty of our community wears down. The volunteers have dwindled to a stalwart few, and as we age, more and more of our community upkeep will require spending money for services. Unfortunately this is in parallel with the aging of our physical plant, which will require more attention as it ages.

Do you know that the volunteers who produce this Chant newsletter actually generate income for us? Our thanks to the volunteers who set up and return the chairs for our meetings, replace the filters in our clubhouse heaters and perform all sorts of other tasks that save us money. Another of our key committees is the finance committee that watches our expenditures to insure we get the best bang for our

buck+. A thank you also goes to the Social Committee for all the events they organize throughout the year, and to the Clubhouse Committee that sees to the care and upkeep of our clubhouse and its contents. The Maintenance Committee takes care of the rest of the property, fixing the gates, overseeing the pond care, and more. The Landscape Committee will be working with our landscape contractor to assure the appearance of our community is the best ever.

As I have reported previously, the Robertson Douglas Group (RDG) has confirmed their intention to satisfy their obligations under the bond held by the Township. Members of the Board will be meeting together with the Township and the RDG in early Spring to finalize the list of items to be completed.

A major part of the charm of Enchantment is a result of the work of volunteers. Being a volunteer gives you a greater sense of community and helps you develop new friendships. This really contributes to a %small town+atmosphere and helps you to %live the Dream+.

Snow in January! Snow in February! What's up with this rate we may get snow March. Who would have thought this could be possible? We are after all, the Garden State. Global warming? Who came up with that? Must be some scientist from South America! No doubt we are all sick of this weather and can't wait for spring to arrive. Thankfully it's only a few weeks away. My golf clubs are slowly getting ready to come out of hibernation. I just need my body to defrost.

Compared to last winter, this year actually hasn't been so bad. We have had quite a few snow events but nothing like last year's unrelenting major snow storms that killed our budget. Between our \$90,000 budget line, the remaining approximately \$20,000 in our snow reserve, and the small township rebate, I'm hopeful that we can get through this winter and December without any shortfall of funds. We spent \$37,000 in January and \$43,000 in February so in the end we are at the mercy of Mother Nature who we all know is rather unpredictable. Just as a reminder, I recommended and the board approved the \$90,000 for snow since it was the average amount that we have spent over the years. Averages can be tricky. Spend \$35,000 one year and \$145,000 the next and the average is \$90,000. One year

you're a hero and the next you're a bum. As always, the board's top priority is the safety of our residents when making decisions about snow removal and salting the roadways.

The 2015 year has gotten off to a typical start with no atypical expenses. Our cash position is good due to the fact that we have approx. \$90,000 in our Working Capital Fund. These funds give us cash to use early in the year when expenses like snow removal exceed our income from monthly dues. Without it we would have major cash flow issues. As usual, I'll keep paying our vendors and funding our reserves. The board and I, along with our manager, will monitor our funds to make sure our community needs are met in a fiscally responsible manner.

Looking forward to this spring, Steve and I hope to be walking the community with Township representatives and Fred Patterson from RDG. The goal is to finally get transition done. They both have made a commitment to the board to be here and seriously get our remaining issues resolved. Hopefully this can be accomplished. I'm looking forward to seeing you around the community when we finally defrost.

For those of you who walk around the pond you have probably noticed that we had some repair work done on the path. There is still some more that needs to be done but it has just gotten too cold. A project for the spring.


C&L Contractors will be sealing the parking lot again in the spring at no cost to the community. They sealed it last year but it did not take and they have offered to seal it again at no cost to us.

The budget is posted on our web site for those interested in reading it.

The new stop sign on Sedona and Monte Carlo is working. MOST drivers stop and then proceed. We are going to be adding a Stop Sign on the exit side of Sedona at the intersection with Monte Carlo. That will make the intersection a 4 way stop.

We are obtaining the snow and leaf removal bills from the contractors and submitting them to the township for reimbursement. We do not get full reimbursement but every little bit counts, usually a few hundred dollars.



December 2nd we had our Holiday Luncheon at Mannino's 3. It was a great success.






In February we had a soup/salad and sandwiches in the club house and all the women made delicious goodies. Everyone had a great time.





Instructions



There are two ways the visitor gate can be opened:

A visitor can stop at the call box at the visitor entrance lane and using the “A” or “Z” buttons, locate the last name of the resident to be visited. When the name is selected, the visitor presses the “CALL” button. A phone call is placed to the resident, who can answer the phone. The visitor can converse with resident using the call box, and the resident can open the visitor gate by pressing 9 on his telephone key pad. If the resident does not want the visitor to enter, the resident can press the star button (*), or hang up and the call box will be disconnected. If residents do not have their key fob with them, residents can enter the community by using the visitor gate call box. In this instance the resident presses the pound or number key (#) on the call box followed by the last four digits of the phone number that is on record.

The gate will then open. Entering pound (#) followed by 1111 will open the gate up until 8pm.
